**ENTEK ENERGY ANNOUNCES COMMENCEMENT OF DRILLING AT ROBIDOUX
13-15T WELL IN MOFFAT COUNTY COLORADO**

Highlights

- The well started drilling ahead from 725' at 10:30am on Thursday 5th November 2009 and is currently drilling ahead at 100 ft/hr at a depth of 1002'
- The first section will be drill to 6200' underbalanced using nitrogen targeting the Mesaverde Coal & Sand sequence, the Deep Creek sand, and the Mancos Formation, including a volcanic sill fractured reservoir
- The second section will be drilled with foam, underbalanced to target and protect the Niobrara Formation
- The follow up to a successful 13-15T well will be the Battle Mountain 14-15 well, permitting is complete and site works have started.
- The two wells form part of ENTEK's farm-in program and follow-up on 14 successful well services of coal bed methane wells on the Slater Dome structure and successful oil and gas testing of the Focus Ranch 12-1 well.

Chief Executive Officer's Comments

"These very exciting wells are located on the Slater Dome structure, where we already have coal bed methane (CBM) production and revenue. The wells will test high rate gas charged sands, all producing coal measures, and the hydrocarbon rich Mancos and Niobrara Formations. Following our very successful testing of oil and gas from the Upper Niobrara in the Focus Ranch 12-1 well in August this year, we are keen to prove that the play exists across all of our leased acreage.

The wells are located adjacent to our existing facilities which will allow immediate tie in to market for oil and gas encountered at these locations.

We are confident that the wells will be successful in that they are adjacent to our best producing CBM well, up-dip from a well that has already tested the high rate gas charged sands, and up-dip from a well with encouraging oil shows throughout the Mancos and Niobrara Formations."

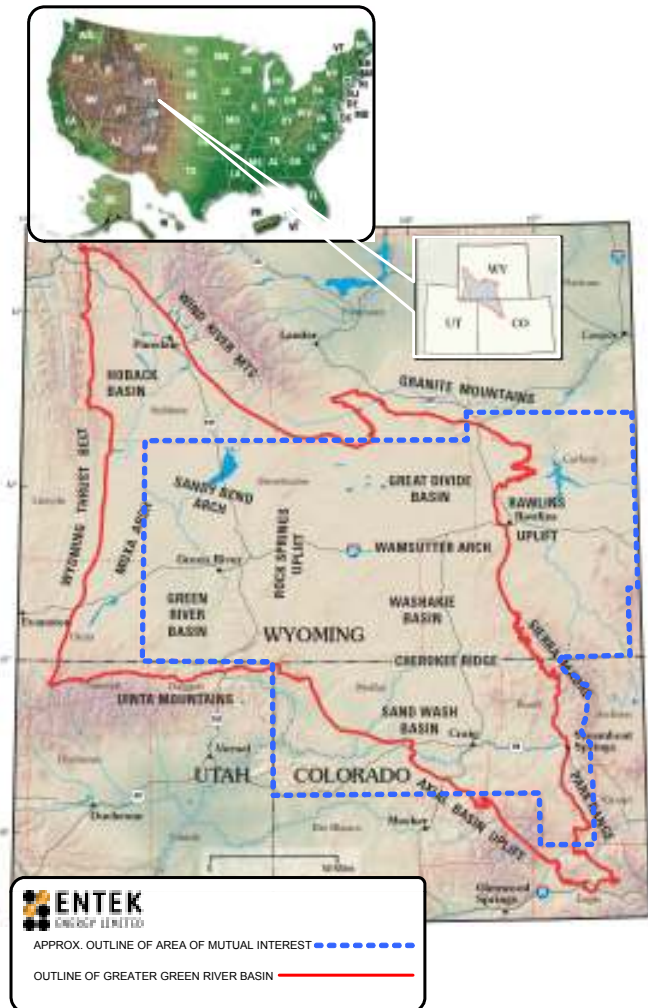
Two new well locations have been permitted on the Slater Dome structure. The first well to be drilled, the Robidoux 13-15 Twin is located in Moffat County, Colorado. The second well, Battle Mountain 14-15, will be drilled immediately after success at the first well on the other side of the Slater Dome structure.

BACKGROUND

On June 26th 2009, ENTEK announced a conditional offer to earn up to 55% of New Frontier Energy Inc.'s (NFEI) interest in a large acreage portfolio (approximately 66,000 acres) in the Green River Basin in Colorado and Wyoming in the USA had been accepted subject to completion of documentation.

On August 13th 2009, ENTEK announced that a farm-in agreement had been executed.

ENTEK commenced the farm-in program immediately following execution, performing work-overs of wells on the Slater Dome Field and a successful test of oil and gas from the Focus Ranch 12-1 well. The drilling of the Robidoux 13-15T and Battle Mountain 14-15 wells is a continuation of the farm-in program.
